



Éditions XYZ is a Quebec publishing house founded in 1985. It is now part of Groupe HMH, which represents four publishing houses (XYZ, MultiMondes, MD, and Hurtubise) along with a distribution structure.

Because it feels literature to be a place of freedom with shifting borders, stretching as far as imagination allows, XYZ makes room for singular voices to spell out multiple tonalities of truth, distorting them and inhabiting them so as to make them all the more tangible.

XYZ is all about facts and fiction; literary works that explore identities, territories and possibilities; novels, graphic novels and essays that shake you up, move you, pull you to new heights, towards the horizon and its furthest shore: that of the unfathomable self.

Among the publishing house's authors that have left their mark on the overseas literary landscape is Jocelyne Saucier with her international bestseller *II pleuvait des oiseaux* (*And the Birds Rained Down*). Translated into some 16 languages and adapted for film in 2019, the book has won numerous major literary awards throughout the years. Saucier's most recent title, *À train perdu* (*Miles To Go Before I Sleep*), is equally appealing to foreign readers, has already gathered rave reviews in Canada and Germany, and is set to be published in many other countries.

Meanwhile, stories vibrant with humanity and humour by renowned author Marie-Renée Lavoie, such as her touching La petite et le vieux (Mister Roger and Me) and her bittersweet Autopsie d'une femme plate (Autopsy of a Boring Wife), have been translated into over 10 languages.

XYZ's emerging committed and upmarket literary voices are getting noticed abroad; notably, Gabrielle Filteau-Chiba's name is building momentum worldwide with her ecofeminist triptych, infused in nature writing influences: *Encabanée* (*Gimme Shelter*), *Sauvagines* (*The Wild Ones*), and *Bivouac*.

A growing number of award-winning graphic novels, aimed at readers from 7 to 77, also appear in the publishing house's catalogue; recent offerings include *Papier Bulle* (*Bubble Wrap*) by Simon Boulerice & Ève Patenaude, as well as *La grosse laide* (*My Body in Pieces*) by instant sensation Marie-Noëlle Hébert and winner of the prestigious Prix des Libraires du Québec 2020 (Quebec Booksellers' Award).

INTERNATIONAL TRANSLATION GRANTS

CANADA COUNCIL FOR THE ARTS

The "Translation" component of Arts Abroad funds the translation of Canadian-authored literary works or dramatic works for international presentation or publication. Foreign publishers are eligibles.

Eligible works

Translation funding is available for fiction and short stories, poetry, drama, graphic novels, children's and YA literature, and literary nonfiction.

Amount of funding

Up to 50% of translation costs and a maximum of CA\$20,000 for each translation. Each applicant is eligible to receive up to two translation grants per year. Costs are calculated based on translation fees.

SODEC

SODEC provides financial assistance for the translation of literary works written by Québec authors and published by Québec publishers. This program aims at providing visibility for Québec authors and literature throughout exportation by helping with translation costs for foreign publishers who have bought the rights to a book.

Eligible works

Poetry, theatre, storytelling, novels, short stories, children's literature, human sciences essays, comic books or songbooks.

Amount of funding

The request for funds must be submitted to SODEC by a Québec-based publisher. The subsidy granted may be up to 75% of the translator's fee and up to a total amount of CA\$12,500.







Thus begins Monica's quest to reconnect with what defines her. But she must also heal from the past violence of intergenerational trauma, a childhood uprooted from her culture, and relationships with toxic men. If she is to shed this baggage and return to Pessamit in peace, she will first need to meet with Indigenous women accross the continent to discuss the importance of passing on traditional arts and the power they hold for the next generation.



Élizabeth has always been able to count on Doriane, her best friend since childhood, to face life's greatest joys and furies. But when Élizabeth receives her diagnosis, she suddenly finds herself facing a degenerative illness alone.

And so Élizabeth paints. Wild neon cats, why not? She paints away the anguish that is consuming her. She paints so the children will have something to remember their mother and her creative madness by. But the fear of decline slowly eats away at her; the illness, she is told, will not kill her. It will simply take everything from her-down to her smile and her right to choose, to decide that the time has come to fly away to Neverland and join Peter Pan and the Lost Boys. But the government will not grant her this choice and her family doesn't want to hear of it. It is up to Élizabeth to find her own solution, a death by her own design.

LAVIOLETTE likes composing melancholy songs for string instruments, painting with the shavings of her heart, hugging her dog to her chest, and reading Michel Tremblay's linguistic snapshots while eating cheese curls.



The author, who suffers from a neurodegenerative disease herself, offers a candid exploration of the world of the terminally ill. The text's wry humour provides a brilliant foil for the pathos often associated with illness and death.

The occasionally transgressive references to medical assistance in dying prompts the reader to feel, rather than consider, the issue's deeper implications.

Offers a lesson in self-acceptance, rather than personal growth, and confronts our conceptions of marginalization and our relationship to difference. The protagonist, a mother of two disabled children, makes us question our own judgment of atypically developing children and how society is ill-equipped to welcome them.

With notes of punk, poetry, and searing intensity, it's an autofiction that disturbs and seduces, that makes you laugh and think. It challenges our conception of "normal" through a character who is outraged yet generous, strong yet fragile.

A mother who sometimes just feels like giving up. In the process, the novel shatters preconceived notions of mothers of disabled children often hailed as brave and virtuous. The narrator asserts her right to be an imperfect mother like everyone else—in turns passionate, immoral, and irresponsible.

ANOUK LANOUETTE TURGEON is an advocate for immigrants, and a mother to two genetically marginalized children. After eight years spent filling out paperwork to obtain services that do not exist, she decided to let go and become an artist.

MEDICAL ASSISTANCE IN DYING

L'aide médicale à mourir, une question vitale Normand Cazelais

A tour de force written with great humanity, this essay on medical assistance in dying (MAID) focuses on the often unfulfilled need for emotional support of the patient, their caregivers and ultimately, the medical staff involved in offering MAID.

With tender, thoroughly researched arguments, the text demonstrates how MAID is the ultimate act of compassion and how science can be a wonderful tool for comfort. MAID does not represent medicine's failure to heal, but rather the success of its compassion.

Relying on a long career in journalism, the author conducts a profound exploration of a social issue that is as much a question of life as it is of death. To do so, he interviewed various actors that participate in MAID as caregivers, decision-makers, doctors and the family members. The result is a bold, necessary reflection guaranteed to touch the hearts of every reader.

NORMAND CAZELAIS was a journalist, TV and radio contributor, novelist, and essayist. He was a popular lecturer and guest speaker and the author of some twenty books. He died in late August 2021, shortly after finishing the final essay.



The author plunges into the world of the dying to reveal the deeper issues at the heart of MAID—a very human instinct to survive; our reactions in the face of death; the search for dignity, freedom, and respect; and the right to choose to die.
