



A poetic metaphor that underlines the human desire for external validation by reflecting on our relationship with televised contests shows.



GABRIELLE FILTEAU-CHIBA writes, translates, illustrates and defends the natural beauty of the untamed forests of North America. Her work has been translated into many languages. "I've never been in the wild, in Nature. But I've seen the frescoes that graffiti artists painted onto building foundations, the ones that used to defy the haze of fake sky plastered onto City walls. I've also seen the monstrous creatures in the Regional Film Office documentaries. And the infra-camera images of the stooped forms prowling through the endless garbage dumps that encircle the cities."

Every spring, Thalie watches her mother flee North to the Planters' Camp, where she and her sisters work to reforest the land devastated by the Cities. As Thalie prepares to be left behind once again, she learns that this time, she's authorized to accompany her mother. Her job is to compile the planters' data information to be used for a new phase of the project administered by the Central Authority. Far from the asphalt of her childhood, Thalie will learn her mother's secrets, the abuses she suffered, and why she's so angry with society. She'll also get to know the forest and its inhabitants, as well as what we owe it.





Monica is searching for her freedom, as well as her roots. She has just dropped out of a degree in art history when she has an epiphany at a vernissage. Monica feels a deep connection to the work of the First Nations artist: something about the wound she carries is expressed on these canvases, in these installations.

Thus begins Monica's quest to reconnect with what defines her. But she must also heal from the past violence of intergenerational trauma, a childhood uprooted from her culture, and relationships with toxic men. If she is to shed this baggage and return to Pessamit in peace, she will first need to meet with Indigenous women accross the continent to discuss the importance of passing on traditional arts and the power they hold for the next generation.





Jérémie McEwen is an essayist, professor of philosophy and columnist. He notably published the book *Philosophy* of *hip-hop* in 2019 and edited the collective work *L'artiste et son oeuvre* in 2022. He was a regular contributor on ICI Première for 10 years. "I've always been drawn to philosophy from a metaphysical standpoint. The philosophy of religion has thrilled me since childhood. More than writing it, this book urged itself into being. It exists because I decided to be honest and rigorous."



The housing crisis won't be solved by building new homes alone, because the issue goes beyond a lack of square footage. This complex problem must be approached as an ecological crisis combined with multiple social crises: an impoverished middle class, an aging population, a sense of isolation, and a concrete urban structure that promotes alienation. As a result. intentional communities represent an increasingly promising way forward. Community living allows residents to share strengths individual with the group while recreating a familiar model with a proven track record: a family chosen by its members.

GABRIELLE ANCTIL is a journalist and researcher specialized on the topics of sciences, and the environment who contributes to a variety of media. 



## INTERNATIONAL TRANSLATION GRANTS

### **CANADA COUNCIL FOR THE ARTS**

The "Translation" component of Arts Abroad funds the translation of Canadian-authored literary works or dramatic works for international presentation or publication. Foreign publishers are eligible.

#### **Eligible works**

Translation funding is available for fiction and short stories, poetry, drama, graphic novels, children's and YA literature, and literary nonfiction.

#### Amount of funding

Up to 50% of translation costs and a maximum of CA\$20,000 for each translation. Each applicant is eligible to receive up to two translation grants per year. Costs are calculated based on translation fees.

### SODEC

SODEC provides financial assistance for the translation of literary works written by Québec authors and published by Québec publishers. This program aims at providing visibility for Québec authors and literature throughout exportation by helping with translation costs for foreign publishers who have bought the rights to a book.

#### Eligible works

Poetry, theatre, storytelling, novels, short stories, children's literature, human sciences essays, comic books or songbooks.

#### Amount of funding

The request for funds must be submitted to SODEC by a Québec-based publisher. The subsidy granted may be up to 75% of the translator's fee and up to a total amount of CA\$12,500.
